


Getting to Campion Hall from Heathrow / Gatwick

There is a good coach service from Gatwick and Heathrow airports to Oxford. It is called **The Airline** (see website for timetable, fares, etc.: airline.oxfordbus.co.uk).

Heathrow	Gatwick
<p>The coach leaves from Heathrow Central Bus Station for Terminals 1 and 3, and from bus stop 10 at Terminal 5. For Terminals 2 and 4, you need to use airport transport to get to the Central Bus Station.</p> <p>The ticket costs £24 (returning the next day) and the journey to Oxford lasts about 90-minutes depending on traffic.</p> <p>There are usually two departures an hour.</p>	<p>The coach leaves from bus stops 1 and 2 at Gatwick South Terminal and from bus stops 4 and 5 at Gatwick North Terminal.</p> <p>The ticket costs £32 (returning the next day) and the journey to Oxford lasts about 2-hours depending on traffic.</p> <p>There is usually one departure an hour.</p>


As the coach approaches Oxford, it will make several stops. The driver will usually make an announcement and you have to press the 'stop' bell if you want the coach to stop. The best place to get off is at St Aldate's. But if you continue to the very end of the journey (Gloucester Green Bus Station) this, too, is close to Campion Hall.

If you get off at St Aldate's (outside Christ Church College), cross the road, turn left and walk down the hill, and almost immediately on your right you will see a very narrow lane – this is Brewer Street. You will see a sign for the Cathedral Choir School. Walk down Brewer Street and Campion Hall is on your left just before you go under the glass pedestrian bridge above the street.



Press the bell which is outside and then come into the lobby through the street door which should be open/unlocked (just push hard).

The pick-up point for the return journey is either at Gloucester Green Bus Station or Speedwell Road.



The walk from Gloucester Green Bus Station to Campion Hall takes about 10-minutes.
