<p>Term 1 First Half Sep/Oct</p>	<p>Compassionate & Loving</p>	<p>Pupils in a Jesuit school are growing to be compassionate towards others, near and far, especially the less fortunate; and loving by their just actions and forgiving words.</p>
<p>Term 1 Second Half Nov/Dec</p>	<p>Faith-Filled & Hopeful</p>	<p>Pupils in a Jesuit school are growing to be Faith-filled in their beliefs and hopeful for the future.</p>
<p>Term 2 First Half Jan/Feb</p>	<p>Eloquent & Truthful</p>	<p>Pupils in a Jesuit school are growing to be eloquent and truthful in what they say of themselves, the relations between people, and the world.</p>
<p>Term 2 Second Half Mar/Apr</p>	<p>Learned & Wise</p>	<p>Pupils in a Jesuit school are growing to be learned, finding God in all things; and wise in the ways they use their learning for the common good.</p>
<p>Term 3 First Half Apr/May</p>	<p>Curious & Active</p>	<p>Pupils in a Jesuit school are growing to be curious about everything; and active in their engagement with the world, changing what they can for the better.</p>
<p>Term 3 Second Half Jun/Jul</p>	<p>Intentional & Prophetic</p>	<p>Pupils in a Jesuit school are growing to be intentional in the way they live and use the resources of the earth, guided by conscience; and prophetic in the example they set to others.</p>
