JOB DESCRIPTION

The successful candidate for this position will be expected to:

- To follow guidelines, policies and school philosophy as laid out in the Staff Handbook and Family Handbook.
- To teach Science in the school from Year 5 to Year 8.
- To monitor the standard of teaching and assessment within the Science Department.
- To deliver school assemblies on a spiritual/science theme as and when invited to do so by the Headmaster.
- To work collaboratively with staff to develop whole department policies.
- To support fully the School's aim to provide a relevant and stimulating syllabus that will engage and motivate boys.
- To support fully the life of a Roman Catholic school through organizing subject assemblies and other events that will occur throughout the academic year.
- To share supervisory duties at morning and lunch break and at the end of the day on a rota basis.
- To cover for absent colleagues, on occasion, during non-contact periods.
- To coach boys' games where appropriate and where time permits. *This condition is discussed in more detail in the first interview and is usually an option for those staff that are keen to pursue such a role.*
- To maintain a professional interest in academic research relevant either to the teacher of Science and to engage and motivate the boys.
- To provide parents with timely and accurate information on their son's progress. This would include preparing school reports and attendance at all appropriate Parents' Evenings.
- To maintain and uphold the highest standards of behaviour from pupils.
- To ensure that the School's policy Health and Safety Policy is implemented rigorously in the Science Laboratory and when teaching Science throughout the School.
- To support the Head of Science in delivering annual Science Week throughout the School.
- To be a Personal Tutor to group of approximately 8 boys (Years 7 & 8) or Class Teacher assessing their academic and pastoral needs and meeting those needs as far as is possible within the classroom situation, along with being prepared to teach Science to boys from Year 5 to Year 8, including scholarship.

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- To contribute to the implementation of School policies and procedures.
- To attend meetings and courses and keep up to date with current educational issues and ensure that appropriate INSET courses are attending.
- To help to organise inter-school events and competitions that enable all boys, including gifted and talented boys, to demonstrate their ability in the subject.
- To offer one extra-curricular activity on a weekly basis.
- To take an active part in extra-curricular activities, attend concerts, plays and other whole school events and to participate fully in the wider life of the school. Sharing supervisory duties at morning, and lunch breaks and end of the day on a rota basis.
